## **SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19**

- Fever (100 degrees and above)
- Cough
- Shortness of breath

The symptoms of the coronavirus may appear 2 to 14 days after exposure, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

# HOW IS THE TEST ADMINISTERED?

Tests typically involve inserting a 6-inch long swab into the back of the nasal passage through one nostril and rotating the swab several times for 15 seconds. This process is then repeated through the other nostril. The swab is then inserted into a container and sent to a lab for testing. *Test result times vary based on the lab and capacity.* 

## AFTER YOU'VE BEEN TESTED

If you've been tested for coronavirus or you've been exposed to someone one is being tested, self-isolate until the results come back, according to the Louisiana Department of Health.

### **EMERGENCY WARNING SIGNS OF COVID-19**

If you develop emergency warning signs for COVID-19 get medical attention immediately, the CDC said.

### **Emergency warning signs include:**

- Trouble breathing
- · Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- · New confusion or inability to arouse
- · Bluish lips or face

\*The above list is not all inclusive. Please consult your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning.

Effective Monday, 4/13, most facilities are testing ANYONE with any mix of the symptoms of COVID-19: fever, cough, sore throat, breathing troubles, even stomach symptoms are possible. Fever with cough or sore throat/shortness of breath tend to be classic symptoms- yet, we recognize there are other symptoms and don't want to miss anyone. If you feel you may be infected, call one of the sites to see if you can be tested.

For most sites, testing is walk-up, bike up, drive up. Some sites ask that you bring your ID and insurance card (if you have insurance); you shouldn't be charged either way. Testing is done with full personal protective equipment (to protect our staff) in several tents, which are climate controlled and cleaned regularly for your safety. **Most results are returning within 48 hours**, and you will receive a call back from one of our providers as soon as your test is resulted – even on the weekend.
